



Donate Funds and Medical Supplies to Support UA Mobile Clinics

The Problem: The Ministry of Health of Ukraine needs to provide health services to the more than 10,000 people who remain in the Kherson Oblast.

Hospitals have been destroyed and looted, roads have been damaged, and land mines are a constant threat. There are three (3) hospitals available in the area:

- 1. Clinical Municipal Communal Emergency Hospital of Mykolaiv
- 2. Mykolaiv Regional Hospital
- 3. Mechnikov Hospital in Dnipro

<u>The Ask:</u> MedGlobal is seeking \$141,631 in financial donations to deploy two (2) staffed mobile clinics to the Kherson Oblast for a 12-month duration to provide civilians at the Kherson Oblast with life-saving medical services.

The Ministry of Health of Ukraine has donated two (2) vehicles to provide medical services.





Each mobile clinic will be teamed by a medical doctor, a medical assistant, a nurse, a midwife and a data collector. Medical services will include:

- Medical consultations
- Nutrition services
- Reproductive health services
- Community mobilization
- Laboratory work
- Essential medications

- Health education
- Referrals for complicated cases
- Follow-up care

Deploying mobile clinics is a proactive approach that can provide basic health services to vulnerable people living in Kherson Oblast and can decrease the burdens of the Ukrainian Health System in the area.

The average number of beneficiaries for each team is 770 per month, with an average running cost of \$11,802 for each per month. Data will be collected to establish the impact of MedGlobal services and arising needs that will enable MedGlobal to enhance the quality of service.

<u>About MedGlobal:</u> MedGlobal services the world's most vulnerable populations with work spanning from rapid emergency and disaster responses to sustainable programming for development. Programming focuses on the humanitarian sectors of health, nutrition, food security & livelihoods, protection, and water, sanitation & hygiene (WASH).

MedGlobal has worked in 21 countries since 2017 with field offices in 9 countries. Current efforts are focused on two pillars of activity:

- 1. Emergency Response: Donations of medications, supplies and equipment
- 2. Resilient Healthcare System Support: Training for doctors and nurses

MedGlobal has been working in Ukraine since March 2022. From March to October of 2022, MedGlobal has completed six short-term medical interventions with 25 Medical volunteers and held 44 training sessions on:

- Hospital Preparedness and Disaster Management





- Triage of Trauma Patients
- Point of Care Ultrasound
- Polytrauma Surgical Skills
- Nurse Training

MedGlobal's training sessions have been provided to 1,077 healthcare professionals that work in 199 hospitals in Ukraine, which combine to serve more than 4 million people per year.

<u>About IDMC</u>: Founded in 2007, the Interstate Disaster Medical Collaborative (IDMC) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization which provides support for state and regional disaster medical teams and projects. IDMC assists collaboration and sharing of resources between disaster teams. From education and training, resource typing and targeted EMACs, IDMC develops and shares solutions from lessons learned during disasters. In response to international events, IDMC is applying its learned experience in domestic disaster medical response to collaborate with global partnerships to facilitate humanitarian medical support.

Summary and Call To Action:



- The 10,000 people remaining in the Kherson Oblast in Ukraine have limited access to healthcare facilities.
- MedGlobal is seeking financial donations totaling \$141,630 and specific medical supplies to provide primary care and specialty care services to the Kherson Oblast by deploying two (2) staffed mobile clinics.
- The deployment of these mobile clinics is estimated to provide at least 6,000 people in the area medical services and support.
